Worshipful Master KEVIN P. WARDALLY . . .



Dearest Brethren,

I cannot believe the year is half over. We have accomplished so much together and yet still have so far to go. We began the year with a lecture from our peer Bro. Prescott Harris; to our Black History Month Program that featured one of our preeminent sonic Scholars and the editor of the Masonic Digest, RW Alton Roundtree; we hosted PM Andrew Hammer, author of Observing the Craft – a book that is lighting up the Masonic world throughout the United States; the Lodge initiated ten worthy, well qualified individuals; and we saluted our Past Masters through our Re-Dedication & Re-Obligation Ceremony.

So far this year, our Lodge has been visited by representatives of over 20 different Lodges, and we have hosted Masons from three different continents. We can also take pride in the fact that we have stayed true to the edict of Masons being travelers and we

Have visited 25 Lodges/Chapters throughout the State. We had a contingent of 15 Brothers attend the Mid-Year Session and our Lodge won "Lodge of the Year" at Grand Session this year. In addition, for the first time in many years the Reports at Grand Session will include the names of AUL14 Brothers in seven different reports, which means we have begun to reclaim our place in the history of our great Grand Lodge.

Five brothers have also joined our Sister Chapter Electa #14 - I have submitted all my paperwork to join them there as I demit from Rebecca Chapter #23. I dare say to you my Brethren we have much to be proud of, but we must not rest on our laurels, we still have much to do. I call upon you to continue your vigilance and zeal for the institution. Take the summer months when we will not meet as time to recharge your batteries and to partake in the social activities of the Lodge such as our Family Day BBQ with our Sisters of Electa Chapter #14 on July 2 and in our Masonic Meals on Wheels in August.

Brothers this month as we get ready to pass our Entered Apprentices to the honored degree of Fellowcraft, let us be mindful of our obligations to one another and take special note of two special communications I have included this month. First, I strongly encourage you to partake in the MWPHGL of NY Life Insurance Fund. The program is excellent, ask any insurance agent you know. Please my brothers you have until July 15 to get your paperwork in and I promise you will be hearing from me on the phone and via email as I do not want you or your families to miss out on this opportunity brought to us by our Grand Lodge. I have submitted my paperwork and my check and I urge you to join me.

I was given time at Grand Session to address the body standing with the Worshipful Master of African Lodge 459 #63 to discuss the unfortunate senseless murder of one of our own. On May 29, 2011 Bro. Calvin Luis-Juste of Brooklyn, a 24 year old graduate student and member of #63, was senselessly murdered a few steps from his home. I did not know him personally, but he was a Prince Hall Family member, thus a member of our family. As Masons we should stand up whenever an innocent person is murdered in our community. Bro. Calvin Luis-Juste was one of our own and his murder demands we act. We must call on those people responsible for finding his killers and prosecuting them to let them know that Bro. Luis-Juste had family, that he mattered and that we in Prince Hall demand justice. So I hope that you will join me in calling the Police Commissioner and Brooklyn District Attorney weekly to amplify the message that this young Brother mattered.

Objective

- Increase the payout benefit to the families of the sisters and brothers.

New Plan Benefits

Death Benefit for active members

- \$2 5,000 (if member enrolls before age 70), Reducing to \$12,500 at age 70 and \$8,000 thereafter
- Member's Beneficiary receiving \$20,000, \$10,000 at age 70, then \$6,500
- Member's Lodge or Chapter receives \$2,000, \$1,000 at age 70, then \$650
- MWPHGL Endowment Trust Fund, Inc. receives \$3,000, \$1,500 at age 70, then \$850
- \$3,000 (if member enrolls at age 70 or beyond only Member's Beneficiary receives the benefit)



New Plan Structure

Program will be a Term Life Insurance Policy with no medical requirements

- Open enrollment from June 1, 2011 to July 15, 2011
- Annual cost of \$150 or \$75 semi-annually
- Because there are no medical requirements many of our members with medical issues will benefit greatly

Benefits will be paid usually within six weeks after submission of claim form to the MWPHGL Endowment Trust Fund, Inc. Participating members can name multiple beneficiaries given the amount of the benefit. All proceeds are payable on a tax-free basis

MWPHGL Endowment Trust Fund, Inc. will handle all the operations of the program and all fiduciary responsibilities. The Grand Lodge has no vested interest in Program

Death Benefits for Inactive Members

If dropped member passes away the \$20,000 benefit will be disbursed as follows:

- His/her beneficiary will receive reduced amount of \$5,000
- The balance of \$15,000 will be deposited into the MWPHGL Benevolent Insurance and Annuity Trust Fund

The reduced benefit is designed as a deterrent for members to allow their membership to be dropped

Death Benefit for Demitted Members

- Members who demit can continue their insurance program by making payments to MWPHGL Endowment Trust Fund, Inc.
- Should a member demit the death benefit will be paid to their enrolling Chapter or Lodge.

JUSTICE FOR BROTHER CALVIN LOUIS-JUSTE

Dearest Prince Hall Family of Masons and Eastern Stars,

On Sunday, May 29th, 2011 one of our own was tragically murdered in Brooklyn steps away from his home at 136 Moffat Street. His name was Calvin Louis-Juste and he was a Master Mason in African Lodge 459 #63. He was a graduate of Cortland University, he was our brother, he was OUR family.

And those that killed him must be brought to justice, and those that are responsible for finding his killers must hear our voices and know that he had PHAmily. They must know that we will not forget him, that we demand justice for his birth family and his Prince Hall family.

What can we do? Call the folks listed below once every few days and tell them that you are family of Bro. Calvin Louis-Juste that you are Prince Hall Masons and Eastern Stars and you want every resource brought to bear to find those responsible for his death.

MASONIC FACTS...

Masonic Fact #1

The name "Hiram" is an English translation of the Tyrian word Khurum. While we are indebted to Desaguliers, Preston, Webb et al for much of our Ritual, it is possible that, in the writing the mention of "Hiram" the Widow's son of the tribe of Naphtali, there was an inadvertence in not referring to his father, also named Khurum, a Black man from Tyre.

When Khurum of Tyre designed the two pillars for the front of Solomon's Temple, he was merely copying those two which were erected in front of the Temple of Malkarth, the Tyrians' god, in his home in Tyre. The feast of Malkarth was celebrated at the same time of the year to which Christmas corresponds. So, when the modern dominant religion desired to obtain the loyalty of those whom it was trying to convert; it was decided in council to celebrate Christmas in December

Masonic Facts#2

King Solomon the Wise, third king of all Israel, was probably born in 977, and died about 937 B.C. He began the building of the first Temple on Monday, the 2nd day, Hebrew month of Kislev, year 2992, which is analogous to April 21, (our calendar); and approximately 1012 B.C. Solomon's Temple was destroyed by order of the conquering Chaldean king, Nebuchadnezzat, in 586 B.G. After his return from captivity, Zerubbabel began a second Temple in 536 B.C. While less costly than Solomon's, it was one third larger. It decayed, and the rubbish was removed by order of King Herod the Great, who began a third Temple in 17 8.C., which was completed during the reign of King Agrippa. It was destroyed by the victorious Roman army in 70 A.D.
